She maintained her home in Harlan until she became a resident of the friendship Home in Audubon, May 4, 1991. She was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Audubon

Preceding her in death were her husbands, Clarke Boers and Carl Lykke; her parents; her sisters and brother, Lora Overton; Zola Tessman; and Rex Davis.
