

Norma E. Lambert, 80

April 13, 1920 - Sept. 16, 2000

HARLAN — Norma Eva Lambert was born April 13, 1920, to Lela (Bristol) and Gordon Dent on a farm 1/2 mile south of Redline. She was baptized as a teen at the Redline Church of Christ, and received elementary education at a nearby country school. She was a member of the Harlan High School graduating class of 1938, later attending Normal Training becoming accredited in education. She taught in the Audubon and Shelby County area for 13 years.

June 7, 1944, she married Samuel F. Lambert at the Harlan Church of Christ. Three children were born to this union. Following their wedding, the young couple resided in Harlan for four years. In 1948, they moved to a farm near Redline farming there until 1954. They then moved to a farm near Elk Horn, returning to a Redline area farm in 1969. She was a member of the Redline Church of Christ, Harlan Church of Christ, Eagle Forum, Happy Home Social Club and the Daughter's of the American Revolution. She died Sept. 16, 2000, at Myrtue Memorial Hospital at age 80 years, five months and three days.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Sam, Nov. 26, 1974, and an infant daughter. She is survived by her sons, William Lambert (Pam) of Harlan and Scott Lambert (Kim) of Malibu, CA; seven grandchildren; one great grandchild; sisters, Virginia (Leroy) Mortensen of Audubon and Joyce (Phil) Daringer of Kirkman; and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Sept. 20, 2000, at Pauley Funeral Home with Roy North officiating. Burial was in the Redline Cemetery, with Phil Daringer, Richard Mortensen, Doug Daringer, Craig Daringer, Robert Mortensen and Myron Daringer casket bearers.
