

Francis J. "Jack" Lewis, 83

Jan. 28, 1918 - July 13, 2001

JUNO BEACH, FL – Francis Jackson "Jack" Lewis, the son of William Jackson Lewis and Bernice Ann (Ouren) Lewis, was born Jan. 28, 1918, in Harlan. Jack attended Grinnell College and served as a Lieutenant in the United States Army Air Force during World War II.

He married Florence Day in 1941. They were to celebrate their 60 years of marriage this July. Jack succeeded his father as president of the Harlan National Bank. Upon his retirement in 1980, he and Florence moved to Juno Beach, FL. He was a pillar of his community in both Harlan and Juno Beach. He was

an active participant in many community and service organizations and a member of the Amara Shrine Temple. He was a benefactor to numerous charities and was frequently elected to lead community, civic and church groups. He believed that being a member of a community required active participation and he took that responsibility very seriously. Jack died July 13, 2001, in Juno Beach, FL, at age 83 years.

He was preceded in death by his son, Frederick Donald Lewis, and a grandson, Charles Durham Lewis. He is survived by his wife, Florence; sons, William Jackson Lewis of Marion, MA and David Day Lewis of San Francisco, CA; three grandchildren; one great grandson; his brother, William Ouren Lewis of Harlan; his sister, Luann Lewis Whitmore of Juno Beach, FL; and other relatives.

Memorial services were held Aug. 11, 2001, at Pauley Funeral Home with Rev. Dr. Keith Karstens officiating. Inurnment was in the Harlan Cemetery.
