Mertens, daughter of Robert and
Barbara (Schleier) Kirschbaum was
born Nov. 28, 1895 near Defiance.
She died Jan. 12, 1994 at the
Baptist Memorial Home at age 98
years, one month and 15 days.
She attended rural school and
graduated from Defiance High
School. She then attended a
teacher's college in Harlan before
teaching rural school.

Feb. 11, 1918 she married Henry Mertens. Five children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed near Defiance and built a new modern brick farm home there. In 1960,

they moved to a smaller home on the farm. After the death of her husband Aug. 23, 1969, she continued to reside in her own home until August 1, 1972, when she became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in Harlan. This has been her home since that time. She especially enjoyed reading and writing poetry, and in 1983 wrote a historic article for the Defiance Centennial Book. She was also the recipient of a special award given by the Carroll Writers Club. She was a member of St. Peter's Catholic church in Defiance, St. Peter's Altar Society and the Defiance Centennial Committee.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was preceded in death by her brothers and sisters - William, Gertrude, Ann, John, Michael and Mayme and a daughter Kathryn Casey. She is survived by her children - Ellen Rosmann of Harlan; Virginia (Dr. Richard) Thomas of Scottsdale, AZ; Robert (Jeanette) Mertens of Fonda; and Marie (William) Casey of Griswold; 15 grandchildren, 25 great grandchildren and other relatives.
