In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by three sisters. He is survived by his wife, Anne Miller of Harlan; his sons, John (Jane) Miller of Dallas, TX.; and Todd (Debrah) Miller of Alameda, CA.; 3 grandchildren; one great-grandchild; niece, Helen (Mrs Dale) Gilbert of Adel; and other relatives.
