He was former member of the Bethlehem Lutheran Church at Jacksonville, and is currently a member of the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Harlan.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers, Eldon and Gerald, and two sisters, Arline and Norma.
