

## Carrol D. McIntosh, 72

**WALNUT** – Carrol Dale McIntosh was born in Cleghorn, Sept. 10, 1916, son of William and Agnes Resene McIntosh. He attended school in Cleghorn and graduated with the Class of 1934. He received his Bachelors Degree from Buena Vista College in Storm Lake and his Masters Degree from the University of South Dakota at Vermillion. He served in the Army during WW II.

He married Marjorie Swanson Sept. 12, 1945 at Cleghorn. He taught school in Wesley, Peterson and Quimby. He served as Superintendent along with coaching when he was at Ware. He served as Superintendent of Schools in Havelock, until moving to Walnut in 1962 where he was Superintendent of Schools. They were the parents of one son, Tom. He was a member of the Presbyterian Church, Walnut Masonic Lodge and Eastern Star, Za Ga Zig Shrine Temple in Des Moines; the Nishna Valley Shrine Club in Atlantic; Walnut Community Club; Walnut Historical Society; Walnut American Legion Post and was a past board member of the Iowa High School Girl's Athletic Union. He retired from being the Superintendent in 1981. Marjorie died in 1985. He continued to live in Walnut in the summer and Arizona in the winter. He died in Arizona, March 29, 1989, age 72 years.

He was preceded in death by his father and his wife. He is survived by his son, Tom of Green River, WY; two grandsons; his mother, Agnes McIntosh; two brothers, Bill and Lowell all of Cleghorn; four sisters, Dorothy (Mrs Roger) Allen of South Pasadena, CA; Marjorie Alderson of Cleghorn; June (Mrs Deane) Finnerty of Minneapolis, MN; Norma (Mrs Deané) Finnerty of Minneapolis, MN; Norma (Mrs Lyle) Mc Kercher of Peru, NE; nieces, nephews and other relatives.
