## Chris N. Nelsen, 95

HARLAN — Chris Nymark Nelsen, the son of Peter and Kristina (Christensen) Nielsen, was born Jan. 28, 1892, in Sendal, Denmark. He died April 28, 1987 at Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan at age 95 years, two months and 29 days. He was baptized

in the Lutheran church, and attended school in Denmark.

In 1911, he came to the U.S. settling near Red Line, where he worked on a farm. He attended Barber College in Omaha. He enlisted in the U.S. Army on Dec. 19, 1917, and served his country overseas in the African European Front during W.W. I. After his honorable discharge from the Army on March 24, 1919, he lived in Denmark for two years before returning to the Harlan area.

On Aug. 9, 1923, he married Elise Brondt at the home of her uncle in Irwin. Three sons were born to this union. After they were married, he farmed near Irwin. In 1941, they moved into Harlan, but he continued to farm and operate a dairy until 1984. After the death of his wife on Nov. 21, 1974, he continued to live in Harlan and became a resident of the Baptist Memorial Home in March of 1987.
