JACKSONVILLE — Elmer C. Nelson, the son of Charlie T. and Larsena "Sena" (Larsen) Nelson was born Dec. 12, 1906, on a farm in Jackson Twp. in Shelby county. He died July 20, 1987 at age 80 years, seven months and eight days. He was a member of the Bethlehem Lutheran church in Jacksonville.

In addition to his parents and wife, he was preceded in death by two brothers, Leonard and Peter. He is survived by a son, Donald of Austin, AR and a daughter, Beverly (Mrs Benjamin) Whitman of Applegate, CA; two grandsons; six sisters, Elva (Mrs Hans) Petersen of Elk Horn; Florence (Mrs Wilhelm) Petersen of Kimballton; Edia (Mrs Albert) Marsh of Harlan; Nettie Nelson of Harlan; Frances (Mrs Harry) Wendt of Avoca and Louisa (Mrs Elmer) Groman of Avoca; nieces, nephews and
