He died at the Bishop Clarkson Memorial Hospital in Omaha, NE., June 26, 1993, at ag-69 years, 1 month, and 3 days. In 1957, they moved to Harlan and he went work at Nelson Motors as a auto body repairman.

May 18, 1974, he married Carolyn (Hoep, ner) Owen in Harlan. He continued to work at Nelson Motors until 1977. He then did dry wall taping, was the assistant manager of the Harlan Skating Rink and most recently worken at the Harlan Theater and Video Mart. Since retiring in 1991 because of the health, they have continued to make their home in Harlan. He was a main ber of St. Michael's Catholic Church of Harlan; and had been active in the

Harlan Community Chorus; and the Blenders Quartet.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by one sisted Margaret. He is survived by his wife, Carolyn of Harlan; 1 daughter, Den.
