HARLAN - Arthur John Nielsen, son of John and Sophia (Paulsen) Nielsen, was born on Jan. 5, 1911, in Casey. He was raised in Kimballton, and was baptized and confirmed at Immanuel Lutheran

Church in Kimballton. He graduated from Elk Horn High School.
