## Norman Madsen Nordby, 75 / July 8, 1915 - April 8, 1991

KIMBALLTON - Norman Madsen Nordby, son of Hans Christian Madsen and Kristine Christensen Nordby, was born July 8, 1915 in Kimballton, He was baptized and confirmed in the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Kimballton. He graduated at age 16 from the Elk Horn High School. He then opened a clothing store in Kimballton and later sold it to Folmer Faaborg. He served in the U.S. Military from Jan. 1942 to Sept. 1945 during WW II. After returning from the service he was in business in Kimbaliton and also worked for Paulk & Finn in Harlan, both before and after the service.

Feb. 11, 1948, he married Marjorie Christensen from Audubon. They made their home in Kimballton. He spent many years as clerk for the town of Kimballton, beginning in 1938. He has served continuously from 1947-1988. He has also served as secretary of the Kimballton School board and has sung in the church choir. He died April 8, 1991 in the Cass County

Hospital in Atlantic.

Preceding him in death were his parents; two sisters, Hikla Schoenewe and Sonja Christiansen; two brothers, Albert and Hans: and an infant daugh-

ter, Burnette, who died Sept., 1951. Survivors are his wife, Marjorie; one son. Hollis (Mary) Nordby of Kimballton; one daughter, Braunda Denise (David) Bertsch of San Antonio, TX.; one sister, Dagny Garlock of Pocahontas: and two grandsons.

Funeral services were held April 12, 1991 at the Immanuel Lutheran Church, Kimballton with Pastor Stephen Gronseth, officiating, with burial in the Immanuel Lutheran cemetery in Kimballton.
