## William Page, 73 ✓

March 3, 1932 - June 9, 2005

**HARLAN** — William Laverne Page, the son of Walter Roosevelt and Maud Elizabeth (Fish) Page, was born March 3, 1932, at Avoca. He attended Avoca Schools and later moved to Harlan in 1952. After school, he worked various local jobs until he was employed at Squealer Feed. He worked there along side his brother, Howard, until their retirement in 1994.

Oct. 14, 1950, William married Elaine Olsen at Harlan. Six children were born to this union. After their marriage, they made their home in Harlan. Elaine died Aug. 1, 1965, and William continued to make his home in Harlan.

Oct. 13, 1965, he married Jacqueline Margaret (Schuning) Study at Omaha, NE. They also made their home in Harlan. She died Sept. 24, 1989. He died June 9, 2005, at Myrtue Memorial Hospital at age 73 years, three months and six days.

In addition to his parents, and his spouses, Elaine and Jacqueline, William was preceded in death by his daughter, Debra Jean, and an infant son, Ricky Lee; sister, Betty; brothers, Donald and Howard and sister-in-law, Peggy.
