

## Florence Piittmann, 93

*Nov. 19, 1909 - Jan. 2, 2003*

**WALNUT** – Florence A. Piittmann Pflugshaupt was born Nov. 19, 1909, in James Township, Pottawattamie County, the daughter of Chris and Mary Berge Piittmann. She graduated from Hancock High School.

Florence married Harry Pflugshaupt of Walnut, Dec. 25, 1929, at the home of her parents near Hancock. They were the parents of a daughter, Norma Jean. They resided on farms near Walnut and Minden until they moved to an acreage on the edge of Walnut in 1947. She was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran Church in Avoca, and later transferred to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Walnut. Harry died June 10, 1984, and that same year Florence moved to Peace Haven Retirement Home in Walnut. She worked at Peace Haven for 14 years and was a resident there for many years. She recently had moved to Prophets Riverview Good Samaritan Center in Prophetstown, IL, near her daughter. She died Jan. 2, 2003, at age 93 years, one month and 13 days.

Florence was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Harry; four brothers, Elmer, Harry, Melvin and Everett; an infant sister, Mabel; a son-in-law, Fred Allman; and a granddaughter, Cynthia Sue Allman.
