Hoa Thuan T. Quach was born Dec. 25, 1967 in Cholon, Vietnam. His parents were Thank Ngo and Muoi Quach. He left Vietnam at the age of 10 years and spent 15 months in the Indonesia Resettlement Camp before arriving in the U.S., Nov. 1, 1979.

On the eve of Nov. 14, 1979, he came to reside with the John Ross family in Elk Horn. He was baptized and confirmed in the Elk Horn Lutheran church and was a senior at the Elk Horn-Kimballton school. He was a member of the National Honor Society.

He died at his guardian parents in Elk Horn on Feb. 3, 1987 at age 19 years.

Preceding him in death were his Chinese grandparents; his American grandmother, Ingeborg Ross and one aunt and one uncle. He is survived by his parents: Thank Ngo and Muoi Quach; two sisters: Phuorg and Bink Quach; and a brother: Long Trieu Ngo all of Vietnam; his American parents: John and Shirley Ross; brother: Jim Ross and brother: Hoanh Vinn Quach all of Elk Horn; an aunt in Phoenix, AZ. and four uncles in CA.

Funeral services were Feb. 6, 1987 in the Elk Horn Lutheran church in Elk Horn with Pastor Eugene Soland, officiating. Burial was in the Elk Horn Lutheran cemetery with Pat Greving, Jeff Hoffmann, Jeff Hemmingsen, Jeff Nielsen, Roger Gorka, Kelly Gessert, Walt Jacobsen and Cory Sorensen serving as casketbearers.
