

Hoa Thuán Triev Quach, 19

ELK HORN — Services for Hoa Thuan Triev Quach, a 19-year-old high school senior at Elk Horn-Kimballton, were held Friday afternoon (Feb. 6) at Elk Horn Lutheran Church. Burial was in Elk Horn Cemetery.

Quach, 19, died Tues., Feb. 3, 1987, at the home of his guardians, Mr. and Mrs. John Ross, in Elk Horn.

Quach was found dead of carbon monoxide poisoning in the Rosses' garage. Deputy Shelby County Medical Examiner Dr. David Stillely told reporters Quach's body was lying on the floor of the garage next to the exhaust pipe of a pickup truck. He was pronounced dead at 8:30 a.m.;

the time of death was estimated to be 5 a.m.

Quach was a Vietnamese refugee who came to the United States in 1979.

Surviving are his father, Thanh Ngo, and mother, Muoi Quach, sisters Phuong and Bink Quach, and brother, Long Trieu Ngo, all in Vietnam; a brother, Hoanh Vinh Quach of Elk Horn; his guardians, John and Shirley Ross, and the Rosses' son, Jim Ross, of Elk Horn.

Elk Horn-Kimballton school officials postponed Tuesday night's basketball games and conducted a memorial service in the school gym. Quach was a member of the school's football and track teams.
