Omaha. He also had a specialist's degree in school administration from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln.

Rogers taught English at Underwood High School for four years before being named the first principal of the newly completed Neola Tri-

Center High School in 1962. After a three-year stint as principal, Rogers was named Neola T-C superintendent at the age of 29, making him the youngest superintendent of schools in Iowa history.
