ber of St. Michael's Catholic Church in Harlan.

Preceding him in death were his parents. He is survived by his wife, Margaret Rosman of Harlan; two sisters, Rose (George) Austria of Omaha, NE.; and Theda (Joe) Flies of Harlan; one brother, Louis (Irene) Rosman of

Harlan; nieces and nephews and other relatives.
