LOGAN — Dwight A. Reep, age 88, of Logan, passed away Friday, June 15, 2012 at the Westmont Care Center in Logan. Dwight was born October 9, 1923 in Magnolia to Walter and Clara (Schuelzky) Reep. He attended the Magnolia School and graduated with the class of 1941. After graduation he farmed in the Magnolia area.

Dwight was married February 9, 1947 to Wilma Niedermyer of Pisgah. They farmed on the Niedermyer farm for fifty-one years, from there moving to Logan in 1998.
