

Agnes M. Rosmann, 78

March 5, 1922 - July 24, 2000

HARLAN - Agnes M. Rosmann was born March 5, 1922, to Martha (Reinig) and Henry Wingert at Panama. She was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary of the Assumption Catholic Church in Panama. She attended elementary school at Washington #1 Township School and St. Mary's High School in Panama. At the age of eight, Agnes' mother died, and later while in high school, she cared for her ailing father.



Sept. 9, 1941, she married Leonard Carl Rosmann at St. Mary of the Assumption Catholic Church in Panama. They became the parents of three children. After their marriage, they farmed near Westphalia, until moving to Harlan in 1982. Oct. 9, 1997, she became a resident of Elm Crest Retirement Community in Harlan. She was a former member of St. Boniface Catholic Church in Westphalia, where she was also active in the Altar and Rosary Society. She was a 4-H leader and a member of the Westphalia Sewing Circle. Following her move to Harlan, she became a member of St. Michael's Catholic Church where she also served as a member of the St. Michael's Guild Circle. She died July 24, 2000, at Elm Crest Retirement Community at age 78 years, four months and 19 days.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Leonard Rosmann in 1996; grandson, Scott Rice; and brother, Leo Wingert. She is survived by her children, Martha (Thomas) Rice of Springfield, MO; Mary Agnes (Roger) Brown of Hartland, WI; Kenneth Rosmann (Pam) of Harlan; seven grandchildren; two great grandchildren; brothers, Ray Wingert (Viatora) of Earling; Anthony Wingert (Rosemary) of Avoca; and a sister, Marie (Herb) Blum of Westphalia; and other relatives.
