AVOCA – Alma Anna Schaaf was born Sept. 3, 1895 on a farm in Fairview twp., Shelby co. She was the daughter of Nicolaus and Minnie Reimers Karstens and was one of two daughters in the family. She attended a rural school in Shelby Co., and in 1910 moved to Avoca with her parents, where she finished her education in the Avoca Public School.
