## Clarence Edward Schlicht, 88 May 5, 1904 — July 1, 1992

ATLANTIC — Clarence Edward Schlicht was born on a farm south of Walnut May 5, 1904. He was the son of Jerry and Anna Schroeder Schlicht. He was one of 8 children in the family. He attended country school near his home.

He married Evelyn Andersen. They were the parents of two children. He was engaged in farming until entering the Army May 7, 1942. He served in the Army for over two and a half years. He was stationed in Anchorage, AK., while he served in the Air Force With the 39th Air Depot Group. He later decided to become a cook. He left the service in 1945 and returned to farming. When his marriage failed, he moved to CA., to a job of milking cows at a large dairy. He moved around to many different dairies in many different states until his retirement in 1978.

He first entered a care facility in ID. He returned to lowa to be closer to home and relatives. He was a resident in the Salem Lutheran Home in Elk Horn until three years ago when he entered the Atlantic Care Center. He died at the Cass County Memorial Hospital in Atlantic July 1, 1992, at age

88 years, 1 month and 26 days.

He was preceded in death by his parents; 3 sisters, Alma Petersen, Lizzie Troll and Maggie Feldman; two brothers. John Schlicht and Harry Schlicht. Survivors are his two children, Richard Schlicht of Seal Beach, CA., and Ramona Sprankling of San Pedro, CA.; 4 grandchildren; 4 greatgrandchildren; a sister, Lillian Hipple of Tipton; and a brother, Marvin Schlicht of Walnut; nieces, nephews and other relatives.
