

## Denny L. Schuemań, 49

**AVOCA** — Denny Lee Schueman was born at Avoca on Sept. 17, 1938. He was the son of Rudolph and Grace Garrison Schueman. He was one of ten children in the family. He attended school in Avoca.

He became associated with the trucking business as a very young man along with his father and brothers. He married Valdine Andersen on Sept. 20, 1958 at Harlan. They made their home in Avoca. They were the parents of four children: Steven, David, Denise and Dean. He started the Denny Schueman Trucking Company in Avoca. The truck line name was later changed to Double "S" Truck Line, which he operated out of Omaha, NE. He was a member of the Trinity Lutheran Church in Avoca and also was a member of the Nebraska Motor Carriers Association. He suffered a heart attack at his home in Avoca and died at the Myrtue Memorial hospital in Harlan on Oct. 22, 1987 at age 49 years.

He was preceded in death by his parents; three brothers: Frank, Walter and John. He is survived by his wife, Valdine; three sons: Steven, David, Dean; one daughter: Denise (Mrs Rodney) Hargens all of Avoca; four grandchildren; two brothers, James of Avoca and George of Oakland; and four sisters: Bernice (Mrs John) Green of Glendale, CA; Peggy (Mrs Kent) Cvejdlík of Carter Lake; Margaret (Mrs Robert) Maassen of Avoca; Kay (Mrs Bruce) Havick of Harlan; nieces, nephews and other relatives.
