He operated this business until 1982 when they moved to Jefferson. He then sold RV's for Harrison Ford. In 1991, he retired and they moved back to Harlan. This has been their home since that time. He was a member of St. Michael's Catholic Church in Harlan.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by three brothers, Lawrence, John and Raymond; and two half sisters, Frances Irwin and Ellen Stoll.
