Manilla - Francis "Dale", son of Francis and Nellie Green Snyder, was born Nov. 20, 1910 near Irwin. He grew up near Manilla and attended rural schools. He then worked on the home farm.

He was a member of the Trinity Lutheran Church and American Legion Post 132. Due to failing health he entered Manilla Manor Nursing Home in 1994. He died Sept. 16, 1995 at Manning General Hospital at age 84 years, 9 months, and 27 days.

He was preceded in death by his parents and two sisters Goldie Roberts and Cecil Wiese Scheuler.
