## Russell W. Stein, 64

Stein, son of John and Helen
(Daeges) Stein was born March 5,
1928, on a farm near Portsmouth.
He died May 8, 1992, at the
Veterans Administration Hospital in
Houston, TX., at age 64 years, 2
months and 3 days. He was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary's

This interest in music he continued by playing in area orchestras and by playing the organ for several Omaha churches. He was a member of St. Bernard's Catholic Church in Omaha.

Preceding him in death was his father. He is survived by his mother, Helen Stein of Portsmouth; a brother, Richard Stein of Omaha, NE.; a sister, Cindy (Fred) Jones of Omaha; a foster son, Perry G. Cole of Fremont, NE.; four foster grand-children and other relatives.

A Mass of Christian Burial was concelebrated May 13, 1992 at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Portsmouth with Rev. Mike McLaughlin, celebrant and Msgr. Francis Schmitt, concelebrating.
