

Everett Eudean Selby, 58

Nov. 30, 1943 - Nov. 26, 2002

CORYDON – Everett Eudean Selby was born Nov. 30, 1943, to Everett and Celia Selby. Eudean grew up in rural Sewal and attended elementary school in Sewal. Growing up on the farm, he was an active member of 4-H and attended the Evangelical United Brethren Church. He attended Cambria-Corydon High School where he remained active in 4-H, football and FFA. He was a graduate of the class of 1962. After graduation, he enlisted in the National Guard, serving from 1962-1968.

May 6, 1967, he married Lola Dodson at the Little Brown Church in Nashua. The couple made their home in Corydon where he was employed at Hy-Vee, later moving with the company to Bedford and Red Oak. During this time the couple was blessed with four children, Patricia, Brian, Shanda and Kara. They moved to Harlan, where they made their home for 15 years. He was employed with Agriland Farm Services and later Jim's Wholesale Meats. In 1993 Eudean and Lola moved back to Wayne County to his family farm. Eudean was currently employed with Enterprises Transports. He was baptized in 1967 at the Corydon Bible Church. He died unexpectedly at his home Nov. 26, 2002, at age 58.

His father, Everett Selby, and his sister-in-law, Patricia Knoke, preceded Eudean in death.
