

Ida Sievers, 81 ✓

Sept. 19, 1922 - April 8, 2004

PUYALLUP, WA – Ida Belle Sievers, the daughter of Joe Larry and Mabel Hildebrand Woodall, was born Sept. 19, 1922, in Anita. She attended Avoca Schools and was a member of the graduating class of 1940. After graduation, she worked in Chicago until 1943.

March 5, 1943, she married Orville Sievers in Mobile, AL. After their marriage, they lived in Walnut for a few years before moving to Avoca. Ida Belle was the mealsite director for the Avoca Senior Center for many years and a member of the United Church of Avoca. She moved to Buckley, WA, in 1994, where she was very active in the Buckley Senior Center and a member of the Community Presbyterian Church. Ida Belle died April 8, 2004, at Good Samaritan Hospital in Puyallup, WA, at age 81 years, six months and 19 days.

In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband, Orville, in 1987; and a sister, Clara Sievers of Avoca.
