Lynn Steckelberg, 64

Jan. 21, 1940 - Aug. 12, 2004

SPRING GREEN, WI – Lynn C. Steckelberg was born the son of Charles and Selma (Lapel) Steckelberg in Manilla. He was raised on a family farm outside of Irwin, with his brother, Lyle (Dianne Steckelberg) and sisters, Betty (Loren) Langholz and Sally (Joe) Riley. He attended grade school in a one room school house in Fiscus, later moving on to graduate from Irwin High, where he was known as a gifted athlete and singer. Lynn went to college to study agriculture at Iowa State University, Ames.

In 1961, he married Judy. While living in Iowa, Lynn was an award winning coon, pheasant and deer hunter, still holding a buck in the Boone & Crocket record book. Lynn worked road construction and most recently worked for Cardinal IG. He sang with the "Great Imposters Band" and made a record in Las Vegas. For 28 years he was involved with the Richland County Wagon Train. He died Aug. 12, 2004, at age 64.

Lynn is survived by his ex-wife, Judy Steckelberg of Spring Green, WI; one daughter, Charlotte (Jeff) Coleman of Spring Green, WI; one son, Charles (Jeane) Steckelberg of Spillville; and grandchildren, Kaylin, Kall and Krystal Coleman and Riley and Brynne Steckelberg; his brothers and sisters and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Aug. 16, 2004, at the Christ Lutheran Church with Rev. Douglas Larsen-Sell officiating. Burial was in the Spring Green Cemetery.
