In October of 1960, they moved to Atlantic where Clarence opened the first branch of Home Federal Savings and Loan Association.

Norma and Clarence enjoyed traveling to all 50 states, Canada, Mexico, Germany, Austria, Denmark and the Caribbean. She enjoyed camping, fishing and spending time with her children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She was a member of Zion Lutheran Church in Atlantic.

Norma was preceded in death by her husband, Clarence Summers; her parents; two infant children; and her son-in-law, Ralph Le-May. Norma is survived by her children, Vicki LeMay of Pella, Diane (Mike) Leslie of Shelby, and David (Shelly) Summers of Iowa City. She is also survived by nine grandchildren, three step-grandchildren, seven great-grandchildren and eight step-great-grandchildren.
