OMAHA, NE. — George Vincent, son of William and Louise Ruge Vincent, was born Sept. 12, 1909, near Stuart. He grew up in Harlan and attended the Harlan High School. During WW II, he served in the U.S. Army for three years.

July 11, 1947, he married Viola Rasmussen in Omaha. He was a truck driver for the most of his life. He had a garbage route and was employed for G.A. Finley and Lytle Trucking. In May of 1991, he became a resident of the Hickory Villa Retirement Center in Omaha. He died Sept. 8, 1991, at the Bergan Mercy Hospital in Omaha, at age 81 years, 11 months and 26 days.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Viola in 1986 and a sister in infancy. Survivors include a son, Don Vincent of Omaha and step son, Richard Rasmussen of Brooklyn Park, MN.; a daughter, Darlene (Merlin) Remmenga of Houston, TX.; and a step-daughter, Delores (Harold) Wolfe of Lake Zurich, IL.; 12 grandchildren, and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Sept. 11, 1991 at the Burmeister Funeral Home with Rev. Otto Zwanziger of the Harlan Immanuel Lutheran Church, officiating. Burial was in the Union Twp. cemetery in Defiance, with Don Vincent, Maynard Reese, Dick Rasmussen, Albert Kapaska, Merlin Remmenga and Harold Wolfe, casketbearers.
