HARLAN - Jacob "Jake" Vinding, son of John and Mary (Nielsen) Vinding was born Jan. 7, 1901, in Monroe Twp., Shelby Co. He attended rural school in Monroe Twp., and grew to adulthood on his parents farm.

Jan. 5, 1926, he married Vernie Langland in Harlan. Three children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed in Monroe Twp., for five years before moving to a farm southeast of Harlan. After the death of Vernie Sept. 24, 1974, he resided with his daughter, Bonnie, for two years and Nov. 1 of 1976, he became a resident of the Peace Haven in Walnut. In Jan. of 1989, he moved to the Salem Lutheran Home in Elk Horn, and it was there that he died Oct. 17, 1990 at age 89 years, nine months and ten days. He was a member of the Altamont Baptist Church in rural Harlan.

In addition to his parents and wife, he was preceded in death by his son, Eldon, at the age of four months; two sisters, Naomi and Evalyn; and a foster brother, Chet.

He is survived by his daughters, Ardythe (Ray) Lara of Co. Bluffs and Bonnie (Paul) Mitchell of Avoca; five grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; one sister, Alice Haase of Harlan; nieces and nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Oct. 20, 1990, at Pauley Funeral Home with Pastor David Erickson of the Altamont Baptist Church, officiating, assisted by Pastor LeVern Nielsen, Chaplain of the Salem Lutheran Nursing Home in Elk Horn. Burial was in Cuppy's Grove cemetery with Ken Peters, Larry Madson, Dennis Heflin, Max L. Klindt, Ralph L. Klindt, and Jack Messenger serving as casketbearers.
