She attended country school and graduated from Audubon High School in 1942, where she was Salutatorian of her class. While still in high school, she received her normal training and after school she began teaching rural school.

She then taught school in Audubon, Gray, Lincoln and Douglas twps. and Hamlin. For the last 16 and one half years of her teaching career, she taught in the Dedham-Willey school system. All during her teaching career, she continued to further her own education by attending Drake University, Fort Dodge, UNI, ISU and the University of Iowa. She retired from teaching in Jan. of 1983 due to ill health.

was an avid stamp collector, and a 4H leader.

She was preceded in death by her father. She is survived by her husband, James of Audubon; a son, Collin J. Weber, M.D. of Leonia, NJ; a daughter, Vickie Haynes of Walnut; four grandchildren; her mother, Emma Andersen of Audubon; two sisters, lnez (Mrs John) Peckumn of Bayard and Wynona (Mrs Everett) Wendt of Audubon; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Jan. 21, 1989 at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church in Audubon with Pastor Harris Hostager officiating.
