She was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Panama.

In addition to her parents and husband; she was preceded in death by a sister, Emily McGarry, and a brother, Alban Domhan. Surviving her is a stepsister, Helen (Mrs Richard) Van Voorkis of Pleasant Valley, N.Y.; a stepniece, Anita (Mrs Bert) Wolf; other nieces and nephews.
