## Harold Glenn Wetzel, 80

He grew up in the same area, receiving his education in the local country school, Greeley #2. They continued to farm in the Irwin and Manilla area until 1951 when they purchased a farm at Sewal in Wayne County. There they transferred their church membership to E.U.B. Church. While there he farmed and worked at the milk processing plant in Allerton, in 1960 he leased a DX service station as a family project. After he suffered a light stroke early in 1962 the farm was sold and the family moved to Manning where he operated the DX station at the corner of 5th and Main. He later moved to the DX station and cafe on Highway 141, which became a family business. In 1965 they gave up the cafe and station and he went to work at Nelson Manufacturing in Manning and later to Emmert Manufacturing in Audubon. retiring in 1981. He was a member of the United Methodist Church. He experienced health problems in recent years and was confined to a wheel chair. His condition worsened suddenly and he was taken to Manning General Hospital where he died July 7, 1995 at age 80 years and 4 months.

He was preceded in death by his daughter, Judith, in 1978; his parents; an infant sister, Lorraine; his sister, Thelma Erb; and his brother, Lyle Wetzel. Survivors include his wife, Vernie, of Manning; sons: Harold (Joyce) of Kansas City, MO and Robert (Laura) of Kansas City, KS; a son-in-law, Larry Reder, of St. Joseph, MO; six grandchildren all of Kansas City, KS; two great grandchildren; two step-granddaughters; brothers: Albert (Jeanette) of Bayard; Kenneth (Daisy) of Bayard; and Ivan (Marlys) of Badger; sisters: Ruby Jensen of Ankerny and Ilo (Wayne) Miller of Ames; brothers-in-law, Gordon Pedersen (Margaret) of Omaha; Kenneth Pedersen of Irwin; and Altyn Erb of Manning; nieces, nephews and other relatives.
