Harlan - Imogene Logeland White, daughter of William M. and Marie (Jensen) Campbell was born March 6, 1911 in Harlan. At the age of one and one-half she was taken out of her mother's arms on Easter Sunday in 1913 during a cyclone. Later that day she was found in a field, miraculously un harmed, wearing only a petticoat and surrounded by cows. She attended school in Harlan and was a 1929 graduate of Harlan High School.

Feb. 12, 1939 she married Frithjof 'Fritz' Logeland at Emmetsburg. One daughter, Linda was born to this union. After their marriage, they lived in Logan for a short time before moving to Harlan where they established Logeland Studio in 1945. She took professional training in photography and worked in the studio beside her husband. She was a past president of the lowa Photographic Artists Association. After the death of Fritz Sept. 7, 1974, she continued to make her home in Harlan, and in 1976 married Leland C. White. He also preceded her in death May 22, 1981. She continued to reside in her home in Harlan, and it was there that she died Nov. 11, 1994 at age 83 years, eight months and four days. She was a member of First United Methodist Church in Harlan and a member of Alpha Delphians

Society.
In addition to her parents and husbands, she was preceded in death by her brothers - Ivan, Edmund and Dwain Campbell, her half brothers - George, Harold and Owen Campbell and her half sisters - Lucille Davis and Leta Morgan. She is survived by her daughter, Linda Johnson of Scottsdele, AZ; three grandchildren; three great-grandchildren; two sisters - Arlene Montgomery of Harlan and Addy Tague of Noblesville, IN; nieces, nephews and other relatives.

Funeral services were held Nov. 19, 1994 at Pauley Funeral Home in Harlan with Rev. Paul Wilcox of First United Methodist church in Harlan officiating. Inurmment was in the Harlan cemetery. Pauley Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
