## Edna M. Wohlhutter, 78

KIRKMAN – Edna May Wohlhutter, daughter of Lloyd C. and Anna (Sick) Croft was born on a farm near Kirkman on May 6, 1910. She died at the University of Nebraska Medical Center, Omaha on Sept. 28, 1988 at age 78 years, four mouths and 22 days. She attended Kirkman Consolidated School graduating in the class of 1927, and then attended lowa State College in Ames, graduating in 1931.

On Sept. 2, 1931, she married Clarence Wohlhutter at First Lutheran Church in Omaha. One son, Bernard, was born to this union.
