I am sure taking all the care in the land of your little deg. He neans so much to me in more ways than one. This old ribben is just shot and that is all. I will have to get a new one today. It is all full of heles and is raveling along the edges so we bad that it won't go thro the machine.

I get your letter of Thursday today and see that you went to McCemb to see about your blood for Mrs. Carruth. I'm glad you did, Wish I was there I would do the same thing. It don't sound tee good for her does it? I would feel most sad if anything should happen to her.

So you went to that book store, wish I could have been with you as it has come to my mind what I wanted to see there, the book that gives the stories of Kins and their writers. I think it helps one to sing or play them in their true meaning.
