Obituary

Miss Margaret Emma Misner was born in Augusta County, Virginia, Oct. 6, 1864, and died Dec. 21, 1920, being 56 years 2 months and 15 days old.

When but five years old she came with her parents to Iowa and settled south of Des Moines. She was married to Douglas Cale Dec. 12, 1886. About four years ago the family moved to the farm about four miles south of Unionville, where her last days were spent. Mrs. Cale leaves to mourn her loss, her husband and three children, Mrs. Mable Mae Robinson, of Norwalk, Iowa, who is at present in Albuquerque, New Mexico, Bonnie Anna, and William Harvey who are at home.

At about the age of 16 she confessed Christ as her savior and joined the Methodist church. She was a consistent Christian, interested in the advancement of the kingdom, kind to all who knew her, and lived a most beautiful life in her home. The sympathy of the entire community goes out to those who remain, for all who knew her could not help but love her for her Christian spirit and kindly interest.

Funeral services were held at the home by Rev. C. B. Rayhill, of Moravia and burial was made at Orilla, Iowa, her old home.
